Message Truth:

Does church matter to you? If so, how much does it matter? A lot or a little? Many today believe that spirituality matters, or even that Jesus matters, but too few actually think that church matters at all. Sadly, with increasing frequency many often believe church does not matter - that is until they need one. The fact is the church does matter, and it matters a lot. Why? The church matters to Christ; he founded it and calls it His bride. No other organization on the planet has the mandate of the church. The church is the only institution tasked with bringing the light of Christ into this dark world. By God's design the truth about His son Jesus Christ is to be found through His church.

⁸Though I am the least deserving of all God's people, he graciously gave me the privilege of telling the Gentiles about the endless treasures available to them in Christ. ⁹I was chosen to explain to everyone this mysterious plan that God, the Creator of all things, had kept secret from the beginning. ¹⁰ God's purpose in all this was to use the church to display his wisdom in its rich variety to all the unseen rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. ¹¹ This was his eternal plan, which he carried out through Christ Jesus our Lord.

³ After his suffering, he showed himself to these men and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. ⁴ On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵ For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

¹² Then **they returned to Jerusalem** from the hill called the Mount of Olives, a Sabbath day's walk from the city. ¹³ When they arrived, **they went upstairs to the room where they were staying.** Those present were Peter, John, James and Andrew; Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew; James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. ¹⁴ **They all joined together constantly in prayer**, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers. ¹⁵ In those days Peter stood up among the believers (a group numbering about a hundred and twenty)

³⁷ When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do? " 38 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized. every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call." ⁴⁰ With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." ⁴¹ Those who accepted his message were baptized, and **about three thousand** were added to their number that day. ⁴²They **devoted themselves** to **the apostles' teaching** and to the **fellowship**, to the **breaking of bread** and to **prayer**. Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵ Selling their possessions and goods, **they gave to anyone** as he had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their **homes** and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.
