#### Message Truth:

Our marital status, whether as a couple or single, is God's concern. Satan has attacked our families with the tool of divorce. Satan's agenda is to divide and conquer. Many people have suffered the painful agony of being widowed or divorced. Some have remarried; others find themselves single and lonely. Today we will discuss what scripture teaches those who have been widowed and those who are single or single again about their marital status.

#### What the Bible Teaches About Being Single

#### How do you know if you have this gift? Those with the gift of singleness will not burn with lust.

<sup>32</sup> I want you to be free from the concerns of this life. **An** unmarried man can spend his time doing the Lord's work and thinking how to please him.<sup>33</sup> But a married man has to think about his earthly responsibilities and how to please his wife.<sup>34</sup> His interests are divided. In the same way, a woman who is no longer married or has never been married can be devoted to the Lord and holy in body and in spirit. But a married woman has to think about her earthly responsibilities and how to please her husband.<sup>35</sup> I am saying this for your benefit, not to place restrictions on you. I want you to do whatever will help you serve the Lord best, with as few distractions as possible... <sup>39</sup> A wife is bound to her husband as long as he lives. If her husband dies, she is free to marry anyone she wishes, but only if he loves the Lord. <sup>40</sup> But in my opinion it would be better for her to stay single, and I think I am giving you counsel from God's Spirit when I say this.

- In Corinthians, the believer is free to remarry if he or she chooses.
