We Have an Enemy and It's Not Each Other

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Message Truth:

So far in this series we have learned that the first step in our warfare plan is the realization that we do have an enemy but that it is not one another. We have learned that Jesus has and continues to pray for our spiritual protection and unity. Our unity is critically important for our ability to engage in spiritual warfare. In the Model Prayer and His High Priestly Prayer, Jesus taught us to pray for protection from the evil one. Today we will seek to understand how Satan tempts us through our desires so that we will be better able to defend against his attacks upon ourselves and others.

Methods of Satan's Attacks

• For the B<u>eliever</u>

1. Satan's ultimate goal for believers is a compromised and fruitless life beset by heresy and sin.

Do you suffer from spiritual myopia and blindness?

Spiritual myopia occurs when we say, "my will, not thy will be done." This at the root of all carnality. Common carnality has infected the churches of America today. Spiritual Christians are not perfect, but the predominance of their life will be obedience and self-denial. As Peter says (I Pet. 1:8), these Christian virtues will be increasing, and by necessity the works of the flesh or sinful desires will be decreasing.
