God's Character Is Revealed By His Names Sunday, March 7, 2010 Pastor Warner Smith

- 1. We have no spiritual power in ourselves.
- 2. All spiritual power is God's.
- 3. We only have access to this power through His name.

## **Message Truth:**

Our purpose in life is "to glorify God and enjoy Him forever." We will not obey God if we do not believe Him. We cannot believe God if we do not love Him. We cannot love God if we do not know Him. We study the names of God so that we can know Him more and better. The Hebrew people use several names to communicate God's character, goodness and glory. Each name describes a distinct facet of God's character. Focusing on each of these names individually as we pray and think about God helps us give God glory. Praying God's names as affirmations of praise gives Him glory and helps us enjoy Him! Praying the names of God will help us better understand His character and increase our faith. Praying the names of God helps us to better understand the OT and can increase our faith as we pray. Why is this important?

## **Reasons God Answers Prayer**

- 1. The prayer acknowledges God's:
  - Honor God's good name, integrity

- Character qualities of God
- G*lory* outshining of God's attributes
- Sovereignty supreme power, rank, authority
- 2. The prayer is supported by the intercession of J*esus* because of His priesthood.
- 3. The prayer is supported by the intercession of the H<u>oly</u> Spirit.
- 4. The prayer comes from one who is r<u>elated</u> to God and Christ.

This is the name by which God was known to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.
