#### Series Truth:

What, if anything, is significant about a name? It has been said, "Call me whatever you will, just don't call me late to dinner." Do you mind if someone mispronounces your name? What if they get it totally wrong? Those of us who have unusual names have gotten used to people not getting our names exactly correct; but those who know us best know our name and get it right. Is it important that we know God's name? If you know and love God, don't you think you should know His name and don't you think you should get it right? Does it matter? Would it matter to you? What if you are witnessing to a Muslim?

#### Message Text

<sup>13</sup> Moses said to <u>God</u>, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The <u>God</u> of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, '<u>What is his name</u>?' Then what shall I tell them?" <sup>14</sup> <u>God</u> said to Moses, "<u>I AM WHO I AM</u>. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: '<u>I AM</u> has sent me to you.' " Exodus 3:13-14

<sup>14</sup> And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. John 1:14 (ESV)

<sup>9</sup> Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? John 14:9 (ESV)

Because Jesus is the full and complete revelation of God to man the revelation is therefore now closed.

#### Viewing Among Kids is at an Eight-year High

On average, children ages 2-5 spend 32 hours a week in front of a TV—watching television, DVDs, DVR and videos, and using a game console.

Kids ages 6-11 spend about 28 hours a week in front of the TV. The vast majority of this viewing (97%) is of live TV.

68% of 8-18 year olds have a TV in their bedroom 54% have a DVD/VCR player 37% have cable/satellite TV 20% have premium channels

53% of households with 7th-12th graders say there are no rules about TV watching.

In 51% of households the TV is on "most" of the time. Kids with a TV in their bedroom spend almost 1.5 hours more per day watching TV than kids without a TV in the bedroom.

Many parents encourage their toddlers to watch television.
