The Need for Revival - Part 3 Sunday, January 30, 2011 Pastor Warner Smith

Message Truth:

The true reality of the spiritual condition of America remains hidden to most observers. Unfortunately, this includes pastors, church leaders, church members and individuals in our churches, also. We know that God's Spirit exists because He attended our spiritual births, we have felt His presence, and have known and continue to know His conviction. Each of us are like Isaac as he stood before the wells which his father Abraham had dug, knowing that beneath his feet there was water although he was unable to see it, hear it, smell it, touch it, or taste it. To quench our spiritual thirst we must follow Isaac's example and re-dig the wells of our ancestors. Before the digging can commence, however, we must first remove the dirt and garbage that our enemy has used to fill in and hide the water in these wells from us.
