Jesus' "I Am" Sayings in John's Gospel

I Am the Door of the Sheep

Sunday, March 27, 2011

Message Truth:

The third instance of the "I Am" saying (special word construction of the Greek "to be" verb combined with an emphatic personal pronoun) used by John, to reassure his reader of Christ's divinity, is the assertion that Jesus is the "Door of the Sheepfold." When Jesus says "I Am" the Door of the Sheep, He is warning us of the dangers we face in this world. We face robbers and false shepherds. The only safe place where sheep like us can find fulfillment and freedom is the sheepfold.

Message Text:

1 "I tell you the truth, the man who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. ² The man who enters by the gate is the shepherd of his sheep. ³ The watchman opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. 4 When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. 5 But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." ⁶ Jesus used this figure of speech, but they did not understand what he was telling them. ⁷ Therefore Jesus said again, "I tell you the truth, I am the gate for the sheep. ⁸ All who ever came before me were thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. 9 I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved.
